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Challenge overcome: the Revista Paulista de Enfermagem – REPEEn – is coming back

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The scientific diffusion is essential for professionals to acquire knowledge about the nursing and to better understand how much it is present in our surrounding. To increase this knowledge, quality publications are essential, since they help to create a scientific culture. It is in this context that the revitalization of the Revista Paulista de Enfermagem (REPEEn), of the Brazilian Association of Nursing, São Paulo Section (ABEn-SP) occurs. It reborn thanks to the effort and enthusiasm of the Board of Directors of the Studies and Research in Nursing Center (CEPEEn) and of the Board of Directors of the Brazilian Association of Nursing, São Paulo Section (Management 2017-2019). Created in February 21 of 1981, the REPEEn, official periodical of the ABEn-SP, had as its concern, throughout its trajectory, the publication of studies that demonstrated the nursing performance about several slaves, contributing to the advancement of profession. Throughout its 37 years, the REPEEn ceased to be published for eight years (last publication was in 2009, v.28), now returning with the aim of continuing as an important vehicle for scientific communication for the State of São Paulo, for the Brazil and the world. It aims to disseminate the scientific production of interest for the Nursing, including the production that express the political project of the ABEn-SP. Its target public are nursing professionals and students and of other Health areas. The revitalization process was initiated in the second semester of 2017. Initially, all articles were archived and approved by the reviewers of the period. Later, it was performed contact with the authors to verify the prior publication of the article, and, in case of negative, the interest in publishing it. After this phase and with the consent of the authors, the v. 29 no. 1, 2, 3, 2018; January/December, present here was composed. The alterations conducted in the editorial policy of the REPEEn up to now concern: publication exclusively in the electronic version, change in the lay-out, new editorial board and ad hoc reviewers, preparation process, submission, evaluation and publishing of the manuscripts. Information about these aspects are available on the REPEEn website (www.repen.com.br). The REPEEn is indexed in BDNF database and in LILACS, and will be published on a quarterly basis.

The 14 articles of the volume 29 address: the performance of nurses of hospital pediatric units in the education in healthcare; the dramatization as strategy facilitator in the learning

teaching process of the nursing students; the critical analysis of the nursing assistants/ technicians; the professional autonomy of the obstetric nurse; the contemporary challenges of the practice of teaching; the professionals' training for the work with families; the management of risks in the hospital context; standard of nursing record and legal requirements; the paternal participation in the prenatal; removals in newborns; social representation about alcohol/drugs users; accidents with biological material; maternal experience and syphilis, and ethical issues in nursing practice. The process of revitalization of the REPEEn has implicated hard work in order to maintain attractive and sustainable this reliable journal. Efforts will be conducted so that the REPEEn classification can reach the desired level. The REPEEn expects to receive your manuscript to compose the next volumes. All aid received has been welcomed for the purpose of revitalizing the REPEEn. Acknowledgements are important and are expressed in the support received from the Board of the Brazilian Association of Nursing - São Paulo, the Board of the National Brazilian Association of Nursing, especially, from the Board of the Center for Social Communication and Publications, and from the Director of the Center of Studies and Research in Nursing of the ABEn Nacional. Considering that there are excellent periodicals for publication in the country, it is projected that the REPEEn can make a difference, attracting and offering quality content for the community. This editorial closes with Jane Robinson's words that translate this important moment for the REPEEn: "A global community of nurses dedicated to improve the health indicators and the standard of providing care should use all the means to communicate freely"(1). Wellcome REPEEn, the Nursing is waiting for you!
